#### Turning adversity into an opportunity

The pandemic of COVID 19, took the entire world by storm and left everyone trying to grapple with the situation and unprecedented times of challenges and change. With the entire country being in the lockdown phase 1 and 2, it was next to impossible to have regular school and classes for students.

At the same time, it was absolutely essential to keep the students constructively engaged and learning even while the entire nation was in a lock down period. The GDGPS 48 team, undeterred and unruffled by the challenges all around, was on one hand getting ready with E report cards for the academic session and closure of the session 2019-2020 and on the other hand completely engrossed in preparing for the new normal and the change.

The School Management and the school leadership team, within a short span of time, prepared alternate plans and started researching for the best possible solution to conduct classes during the pandemic. Within no time, the school switched to online classes and was ready, with several E resources and synchronous and asynchronous study modules and resources as well as a well-equipped and trained team, to impart education on the virtual platform. Online interactive modules, e- notes were made available to all the students and back end

training started for leaders and teachers. Allteachers were engaged in continuous training to equip them with skills required to conduct Online Interactive classes.

The dynamic school team reinvented and redesigned and structured itself as per the need of the hour and within no time switched to complete virtual school set up . All stake holders were provided training and taken along at each step.

This was made possible because of the readiness for change, ability to adapt to change and availability of E- Resources and well trained staff.

The Virtual platform was used to rediscover the strengths of the school system and all efforts were made to prepare well for this change.

While there was fear of the unknown, insecurities, challenges all around, students and staff of the school was engaged using the constructivist approach to learning by actively involving the learners in engaging activities, research projects, creative pursuits, visual and performing arts, health and well -being programmes and variety of scholastic and co-scholastic activities to keep the students positive, empowered and constructively busy discovering their innate talents and abilities.

The school was so dynamic in its approach that it kept bringing in newer dimensions to the scholastic and co-scholastic endeavours of the school even during this long phase of pandemic.

At every step, the leadership team trained itself and then imparted training to the teachers followed by training the learners. Even before conducting Online Assessment, complete training was imparted to all stakeholders.

Innovative Virtual Assemblies ,using google meet links, became a part of the new normal and all students took up to this platform like a duck takes to water. This was because the school always believed in equipping students with skills and providing opportunities to each and every student.

Be it Virtual assemblies, Support, Practice and Enrichment Classes, House meetings, Intra and inter class competitions or COEP, the school made sure that every programme was refurbished and restructured as per the present situation and launched with a fresh perspective to meet the learning outcomes.

COEP 2020, the in house skill based ten day programme, was yet another milestone in the history of the school as the school came up with yet another innovative plan with three components of achieving Scholastic excellence by enhancing study skills, skill based interactive sessions and The Goenkans Broadway show, adding yet another dimension to the way school programmes are presented and opportunities given to students to conduct complete shows, managing the technical aspects and making ten successful presentations woven around five themes.

Research based integrated sports projects was another opportunity provided to all the Goenkans where they all learned about making project proposals, collecting and analyzing data, deriving relevant information, compiling and presenting the project report through videos, enactments, project presentations. The work was assessed by peers, teachers and parents and was an absolute delight to watch.

The school won high acclaim from Curtin University, Australia for the research based projects taken up by the students of GDGPS 48.

School was honoured with the title of being an Exemplar School by Jamia Millia Islamia University for its outstanding contribution in the field of education even during the pandemic. The Leadership team was invited to train teachers on conducting assessments using Online tools.








# WHAT IF Movie Making Competition





The teachers also explained the importance of eating a judicious amount of sweet treats and ice creams and taking care of their health and oral hygiene.











Learners of Junior wing celebrated the rich heritage of their motherland India by learning about the glorious festivals, traditions and culture throughout the month of August.

### JANAMASHTAMI CELEBRATIONS



Middle School years are very special for all the students. The six-year journey of the Middle Wing is all about nurturing talent, giving ample opportunities and providing platforms to students to share views, discuss, learn, apply knowledge, participate in a range of activities and imbibe values. The focus during these years is mainly on skill development, creative thinking and developing competencies.

At GDGPS 48, it has been our endeavor to provide each and every Goenkan several opportunities to participate and learn, contribute and create, ideate and innovate. At the same time, each and every programme, as well as scholastic and co-scholastic activity, is planned in a way that it leads to adding a newer dimension to the child's personality and helps him/ her learn skills for life. The school lays a lot of emphasis on value education. In–house programmes like VLEP and VVAP have been designed keeping the need of different age groups. ICLP is yet another programme, which has been designed by the school team and is an amalgamation of Scholastic and Co- Scholastic subjects. The Art integration that has been highlighted in NEP is very evidently visible in this Integrated Creative Learning Programme of the School.

The assemblies and special presentations encourage 100% participation and are scripted and designed by the students. These opportunities lead to development of confidence in students and enhance their presentation skills. Students of classes III to VIII are adept at presenting value based and thought provoking assemblies on the virtual platform. Many of such assemblies were streamed live and students were given the opportunity and exposure to learn the aspects of live streaming on virtual platforms of You Tube and Google Meet. The students worked in smaller groups on the scripts, videos, PowerPoint Presentations, conducted interviews and did their research. It was heartening to watch the students of different sections come together and adapt to the change effortlessly and present news, thought, theme based assemblies with as much ease as they used to present assemblies in the real world. There was training and constant support provided to each one of them. The impressive presentations by the students were highly appreciated by their peers and parents.

The House System's main strength is of providing students of all ages an opportunity to work together, creating a truly cohesive environment and make new friends who may not be in their own section or class. The

school has a House System comprising of four houses – Radhakrishnan, Teresa, Tagore and Vivekananda. The system has been designed in a way that each child, of classes III to VIII, is able to participate in cultural, technical and literary activities during the house meetings. The three-week cycle provides ample time for each child to be prepared, to send an entry and participate in an event. During the first house meeting, the house wardens and house teachers share the rules and guidelines and guide the students. Students are provided a time frame within which they are expected to submit their entries using the virtual platform. Second session is for participation within the house group and selection and preparation for final round. The final round is conducted at inter – house level and the assessment is done by the judges. The middle wing students had two cycles of inter house events for all age groups. The results (PPT) can be added.

Osmosis and Synergy presentations during the year are another of two engaging platforms given to all students of classes III to V to present their journey of learning and skills development in co- scholastic and sports activities. 'Reminiscence' presentations at the end of the year provide a platform to all the students of the Middle Wing to reflect on their journey and get ready to embark on a new journey.

Even though this year the students are attending classes online, the programmes have been re- designed and restructured as per the needs of the virtual platform. Right from the sports activities to MDAT (Music, Dance, Art and Theatre), classes are being conducted on the virtual platform with innovative modifications in the conduction of the sessions. Not only this, students are engaged in PBL, STEM and CLASS projects too where they are given yet another platform to present their innovative ideas and work in collaboration.

Gracious Goenkan is a programme of the Middle Wing which recognizes students for their values, integrity and genuineness. It is again a step in the direction where goodness is valued. Students are encouraged to self-assess and reflect on their actions and based on their own assessment, they are recognized with a Gracious Goenkan Certificate.

All these programmes and efforts lead to happiness in the environment and holistic development of each and every Goenkan.

Integrated Creative Learning Programme (ICLP) is an in-house programme that provides opportunities to the students of class VIII to apply and synthesize their learning of scholastic and co-scholastic subjects. This programme is a perfect model of art integration and application based experiential learning wherein students are engaged in projects based on beautiful integration and balance of scholastic and co-scholastic subjects. The scholastic topics are integrated with co-scholastic subjects - literature and art, music and dance, music and Science, Language and theatre etc. As an example, I.T. and Science are brought together and students are involved in understanding of the concepts followed by application of the same in real life. Right from the shadow puppets to VR, from dance formation based on mathematical concepts to playing musical instruments and relating it with studies about sound in Science to imagining and illustrating a literature chapter is thoroughly enjoyed by the students.

#### SPE - Support, Practice and Enrichment Programme

A very well designed programme of the school, running successfully into its fourth year, SPE is a programme that provides training, guidance and support to the students as per their level of learning. Students are assigned different groups and different teachers take them through the syllabus and make them practice during these sessions. While the bright students are trained further for achieving excellence with Higher Order Thinking Skills activities, the average and below average students are provided with regular practice and guidance by the teachers.

#### Integrating VVAP and VLEP through School Cinema

The school has two very well-structured and well-designed programmes like VVAP and VLEP for the students of classes VI to VIII and classes III to V. Students are involved in a range of value based activities and discussions during these sessions. The sessions are conducted with yoga helping the students to relax and calm their mind, art helping students to express their thoughts and feelings and the session with the counselor and language teachers making them think, share and look for solutions to the problems. This programme also has the School Cinema programme integrated with it. A perfect blend of entertainment and education, the School Cinema harnesses cinema's power of story telling, emotional connect, visual appeal and encourages thought provoking break-throughs. It's a research, film-based learning module supported by an interactive workbook designed to reaffirm life-skills, values and attitudes in children during their growing up years.

#### CLUBS

The school clubs provide opportunities to students to hone their skills and enjoy the journey of learning. The school has a vision of training the students holistically, and for the same, has clubs for all age groups which cover a range of activities including environmental sensitivity, skills for survival, creative skills, language skills, problem solving skills, I.T. skills, fitness and health awareness programmes, social outreach and community service programmes. These activities help in sensitizing the students, keeping them constructively engaged and also enable them to become future ready.






### CAREER EXPLORATORY PROGRAMMES


